


DIAGNOSTIC CHALLENGE

- "From my lungs"




X-RAY

- Contusion easily seen
- Player stable



PULMONARY CONTUSION

- Signs and Symptoms
 - Chest pain
 - Rales
 - Dyspnea
 - Tachypnea
 - Ineffective cough
 - Hemoptysis
 - Chest wall contusions
 - X-ray will show opacity
 - ABG will worsen in time due to edema



WHAT DO YOU DO?

- I. Admit to the hospital as emergency
- 2. Get help from Pulmonologist
- 3. No practice, get a flack jacket


PULMONOLOGIST

- Rest, repeat x-ray in 3 days
- Safe to travel to USAFA
- Not safe to play
- "He could die, if hit again, especially dangerous in the altitude of Colorado Springs
- Meet with parents, coaches, athletic director and ATC's



UNIFORM RESPONSE

- QB: It's Air Force, I have to play, I am the Captain and the QB, I will risk it!
- Coaches, AD: It's his choice
- Parents: "We want a second opinion, if he dies, it is God's will"
- ATC: We can fit him with a good flack jacket



WHAT DO YOU DO?

- 2nd opinion: "safe to play"
- Player and parent want to sign waiver
- Coach- "it is critical he play- we need you to step up for the good of the team"

- 1. Accept 2nd opinion
- 2. Make parents sign waiver and player can play with flack jacket
- 3. Re-check with Navy Pulmonologist-



OUR RESPONSIBILITY



- Establishes a chain of command for injury and illness management,

 Coordinates the assessment and management of game-day injuries and
 medical problems, Makes the final decisions on clearance to participate, ...
- Understands the importance of the pre-participation examination (PPE)
- Recognizes other issues that affect athletic performance, including strength and conditioning, nutrition, ergogenic aids, substance abuse and psychological response to injury
- Recognizes unique issues in females, master athletes, adolescent athletes, and other defined athletic populations
- Provides for documentation and medical record keeping
- Provides ongoing medical care beyond game-day/event coverage
- Is involved in injury and illness prevention
- Develops and participates in the selection of the athletic care network
- Educates athletes, parents/guardians, coaches and administrators At Sports Medicine South, we communicate directly with each athlete and parent. ...
- Is aware of or involved in the development and rehearsal of an emergency action plan
